

IMMIGRANTS IN INDIANA



Indiana is home to over **350,000** immigrants, **5.3%** of all **6.7 million** people living in the state.¹


Over **38%** of Indiana's foreign-born population lives in Indianapolis.² As of 2016, more than **63,000** lawful permanent residents living in Indiana were eligible to naturalize.³

92,000
UNDOCUMENTED

immigrants live in Indiana.⁴

60% of undocumented immigrants in Indiana have been living in the U.S. for **10+** years.

13% have been living in the U.S. for **20+** years.⁵



174,000
CHILDREN

in Indiana have at least one immigrant parent

86% of these children are U.S. citizens

14% are non-citizens.⁶

33% of Indiana's immigrant population is eligible to vote.⁷



Indiana is home to about **10,000** Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients and over **2,600** Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders. An additional **1,200** Dreamers without DACA live in Indiana. Without a legislative solution, all of these individuals are or may soon become susceptible to deportation.⁸

69% of Indiana residents — including **56% of Republicans** — believe DACA recipients and other Dreamers should be allowed to stay in the U.S.

66% of Indiana residents believe all undocumented immigrants should be allowed to stay in the U.S., including **52% of Republicans**.⁹

Immigrants in Indiana Are Working

Immigrants in Indiana aged 16+ account for **6.1%** of the state's total workforce.¹⁰ Immigrants in Indiana are also more likely to participate in the workforce:



About **66%** of the state's immigrants are in the workforce, compared to **64%** of the state's native-born population.¹¹

Immigrant-owned businesses in Indiana employed **58,000** workers in 2016. **20,000** of Indiana's immigrants are entrepreneurs.¹²



Immigrant spending power in Indiana added up to **\$7.2 billion** in 2017.¹³

Immigrants account for nearly **14%** of all Indiana workers employed in STEM fields.¹⁵

Indiana had nearly **10,800** positions certified for H-1B specialty workers in 2016. **27%** of these workers were computer systems analysts, followed by software developers (**11%**) and computer programmers (**8%**).¹⁶
